Further to "Plan Selby" reference your letter 20th November, 2014. I wish to assist by making a few observations for your consideration.

Employment land: all former air fields, mining pit access sites, closed waste tips, former industrial sites etc., should be used. If necessary the plans for the B. O. C. M. site at Selby could be amended to allocate a larger area for this purpose.

Environmental matters: further renewable energy supplies, Selby has already done more than it's fair share with it's wind turbines, Drax Power Station conversion to burn biomass and it's future carbon capture and storage power station. In the event of climate change, consideration should be given to protect low lying assets, both existing and new construction from flooding from the rivers and rising sea levels.

Farm land: to be protected from building, solar p. v. farms etc. We must retain land to feed the increasing national population from the risk of starvation, if our food imports are restricted by international conflict. Our navy is too small to protect convoys, foreign vessels are unlikely to supply the U. K., our Merchant Fleet is almost non-existent. Selby District should do all it can to retain it's farmland, despite the national government taking thousands of acres of prime agricultural land in the upgrades of the A1.

I have written to Andrew McMillan on two occasions in 2011, reference SADPD 1189 further to North Duffield village.
